Disaster Response Service Project

Disaster survivors need essential items to reclaim their homes and lives. Items needed for each kit:

- One hand towel measuring approximately 16" x 28" (no fingertip or bath towels).
- One washcloth.
- One wide-tooth comb.
- One nail clipper.
- One bar of soap (bath size in wrapper).
- One toothbrush (in original packaging).
- Six Band-Aids®.
